




# Heritage Corner

## Our heritage makes us unique.

### Did You Know !

#### FOUNDING OF UDAIPUR-A GEOHERITAGE ASSESSMENT

Humans have defended their habitation through fortification for thousands of years. Ancient Indian scriptures, again including the *Arthashastra* of Kautilya and medieval literature of Mewad, describe various types of forts. The Buddhist Holy Domes (ધાર સાંધુ) too display details of battlement. Amongst the various types of forts, the following four kinds are of relevance for Mewad.

1. **Guha-Doorg**- Conciliatory Fort-“...the living quarters are situated in a valley surrounded by high, impassable hills. The hills house a chain of outposts and signal towers connected by extensive defensive walls”...adequate farmland and water resources are present to sustain human habitation. Nagda (Naagdrah), Ahaad (Ayad), Udaipur, Chavand are located in a terrain of this type.

2. **Vun-Doorg-Vana-Doorg or Vrikshya-Doorg-Forest Fort**-is characterized by a terrain being surrounded on all sides with a **dense, impassable forest** for over a distance of at least 15 km, as is the area west of Girwa (Guha-Doorg) extending up to Gogunda and its surrounding thickly forested area.

3. **Parvat-Doorg-Hill/Plateau Fort**-Fortification of flat area on a high hill that has adequate water availability atop the plateau, as is at Chittaurgarh (Chittaudgadh) Kumbhalgarh (Kumbhalgadh)...

4. **Nar-Doorg: Human Fort**-King defended by loyal and experienced warriors. Mahabharat speaks highly of such a defensive fort during a well fought battle; ancient Indian, Chinese, Greek, Roman scriptures have numerous such examples where the king/general/leader was successfully defended by human-fortification. The famous example in our case is that of Jhala Maan (Bida) defending Maharanar Pratap at the Battle of Haldighati (June 18, 1576) by creating a Nar-Doorg.


