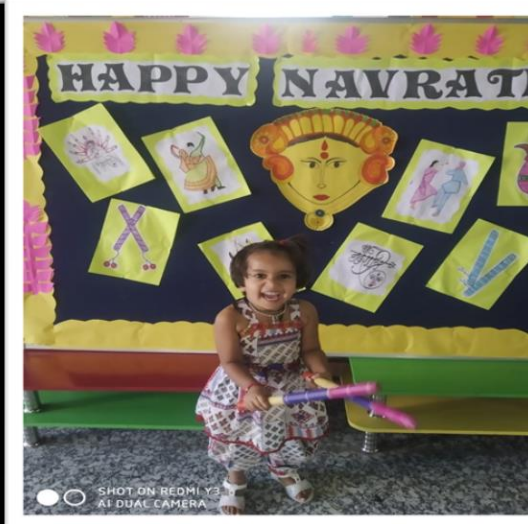

Closing Ceremony of the Plantation Day

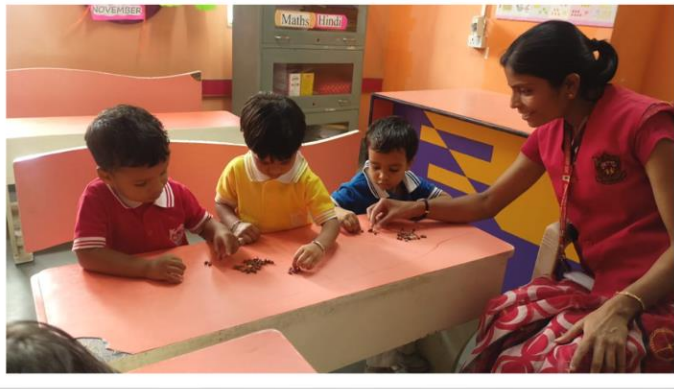

GITA GOPINATH

Gita Gopinath, born on 8th December 1971 in Kolkata and grew up in Kerala. She studied at Lady Shri Ram College, Delhi School of Economics and Princeton University. She became the first female Chief Economist of the IMF, led global economic policies during the pandemic and received honours like the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman. Now, she is the First Deputy Managing Director of the IMF, working on global economic policies and representing the organisation worldwide.



DINESH PALIWAL

Dinesh Paliwal, born on 17th December 1957 in Agra, is an Indian American business leader known for transforming Harman International Industries. He studied engineering at IIT Roorkee and earned a Master's in Applied Science and Engineering from Miami University, Ohio. As Harman's CEO from 2007, Paliwal drove its global growth. His leadership earned honours like the Indian American Achiever Award and Fortune Magazine's 'Businessperson Of The Year' recognition, cementing his legacy in the global business world.

SPORTS

2nd December

The 38th National Games will take place in Uttarakhand from 28th January to 14th February 2025. Mascot Mauli, inspired by the Monal bird and the tagline Sankalp Se Shikhar Tak highlight the state's heritage and spirit. Over 10,000 participants will compete in 38 sports, including yoga and mallakhamb. A torch relay will inspire youth across Uttarakhand.

3rd December

Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi has become the second Indian after Viswanathan Anand to surpass the 2800 ELO rating in classical chess, achieving a rating of 2801. The 21-year-old from Warangal, Telangana, ranks 4th globally, just behind Magnus Carlsen and Fabiano Caruana. His exceptional 2024 season gold at the Chess Olympiad, cementing his place in India's chess legacy.

4th December

India's junior men's hockey team won the Junior Asia Cup 2024, defeating Pakistan 5-3 in the final. Arajjeet Singh Hundal scored four goals, including a hat-trick, while Dilraj Singh added one. Despite Pakistan's strong efforts, India regained control in the final quarter. This victory marks India's fifth Junior Asia Cup title, with players receiving cash rewards from Hockey India.

10th December

India delivered its best-ever performance at the 2024 Asia-Pacific Deaf Games in Kuala Lumpur, winning 55 medals – 8 gold, 18 silver and 29 bronze. The 68-member team excelled in athletics, badminton, chess and wrestling. Notable achievements include golds by Priyanga Paramaraj and Sanya Dongre. Supported by SAI, the team showcased national pride and athletic excellence.

15th December

India's women's hockey team clinched the Junior Asia Cup 2024 title in Muscat, Oman, defeating China 3-2 in a tense penalty shootout. After a 1-1 draw in regular time, Nidhi's key saves and goals by Sakshi Rana, Ishika and Sunelita Toppo secured victory. This marks India's second consecutive title in the tournament.

22nd December

India won the inaugural Women's U19 T20 Asia Cup by defeating Bangladesh by 41 runs in Kuala Lumpur. Gongadi Trisha's 52 and Aayushi Shukla's 3/17 led India to victory. Despite Bangladesh's efforts, including Farjana Easmin's 4-wicket haul, their batting collapsed, losing 7 wickets for just 21 runs in 40 balls.

PRADHAN MANTRI RASHTRIYA BAL PURASKAR

President Smt Droupadi Murmu presented the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar, honouring 17 exceptional children from 14 states and union territories. The awards recognised their remarkable achievements in art and culture, bravery, innovation, social service and sports. President Smt Murmu praised the young achievers for their courage, creativity and contributions, which inspire hope for India's future.

Keya Hatkar

- Keya Hatkar, Maharashtra (Art and Culture): Keya, a 14-year-old with spinal muscular atrophy, was honoured for her initiatives IM POSSIBLE and SMA-ART.



Sindhoora Raja

- Sindhoora Raja, Tamil Nadu (Innovation): Sindhoora, 15, developed a self-stabilising device to help Parkinson's patients, showcasing her innovation.



Rishikesh Kumar

- Rishikesh Kumar, Jammu & Kashmir (Innovation): Rishikesh, 17, founded Kashmir's first cyber security firm, displaying excellence in technology.



Hembati Nag

- Hembati Nag, Chhattisgarh (Sports): Hembati, a judo player from a Naxal-affected area, won silver at the Khelo India National Games.



Anish Sarkar

- Anish Sarkar, West Bengal (Sports): Anish, only 3 years old, became the youngest FIDE-ranked chess player, capturing global attention.



Saanvi Sood

- Saanvi Sood, Punjab (Sports): Saanvi, 9, climbed Mount Everest Base Camp and peaks in Africa, Australia, Russia, and Iran, raising the Indian flag with pride.



Vyas Om Jignesh

- Vyas Om Jignesh, Gujarat (Sanskrit Literature): Vyas, 17, memorised over 5,000 Sanskrit shlokas and performed at 500 events, overcoming cerebral palsy.

SCIENCE REPORT

IIT Madras Completes India's First Hyperloop Test Track
IIT Madras has completed a 410-metre Hyperloop test track, the first of its kind in India. This project is a step towards developing high-speed, energy-efficient transportation. Hyperloop technology, proposed by Elon Musk, uses vacuum-sealed tubes to achieve speed of upto 1,100 km/h, significantly cutting travel times. The Avishkar Hyperloop team, with support from startup TuTr, played a key role in this achievement. Plans include an 11.5-kilometre test track, followed by a full-scale Hyperloop between Mumbai and Pune. It aims to reduce travel time to 25 minutes, showcasing India's leadership in futuristic transport.

Vikas Engine With Restart Capability
ISRO has successfully tested the Vikas engine, which can be restarted. In the test, the engine ran for 60 seconds, was turned off for 120 seconds and restarted for 7 seconds. This engine is used in rockets like PSLV, GSLV and LVM3, and it is important for the Gaganyaan mission (India's mission to send humans to space). This achievement helps ISRO improve rocket technology and become stronger in the global space industry.

INDIA CELEBRATES 76TH REPUBLIC DAY

On 26th January 2025, India celebrated its 76th Republic Day with a grand parade on the Kartavya Path, Delhi. The event showed India's progress (growth), military strength (power of the army) and rich cultural heritage (traditions and history). The chief guest this year was Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto and a special group from the Indonesian Armed Forces also joined the parade. The Prime Minister laid a wreath (a circle of flowers) at the National War Memorial to honour soldiers who gave their lives for the country. Marching soldiers saluted President Droupadi Murmu, the supreme commander (highest leader) of India's Armed Forces.

- Gujarat's float, called 'Swarnim Bharat: Virasat Aur Vikas', displayed the Rann of Kutch, its culture and its role in India's growth.
- Punjab's tableau celebrated 'Knowledge and Wisdom', showing its history, schools and beliefs.

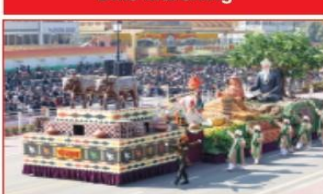

INDIA'S FIRST ZERO-WASTE AIRPORT

Indore Airport, in the country's cleanest city, became India's first zero-waste airport on 22nd December. A comprehensive waste management system recycled waste from planes, shops, gardens and toilets, converting wet waste into fertiliser. The initiative followed the 4R principle – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Restore, minimising waste and promoting sustainability while enhancing economic and environmental benefits. A dedicated 3,000-square-foot recycling plant managed the waste. Civil Aviation Minister Kinjurapuram Rammohan Naidu inaugurated the facility. Collaboration between Safai Mitras and the Indore Municipal Corporation, was crucial to the project's success.



2024 ROUND UP – AT A GLANCE

JANUARY 12, 2024

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated India's longest sea bridge, the 21.8 km Atal Setu in Navi Mumbai. It connects Mumbai to Pune, Goa, South India and airports, reducing travel time significantly.



JULY 12, 2024

Renowned sand artist Sudarsan Pattnaik won the Golden Sand Master award at the International Sand Sculpture Championship in Russia. His 12-foot sculpture of Lord Jagannath's chariot earned international acclaim.



February 13, 2024

Odisha's Guptheswar Forest is now the state's fourth Biodiversity Heritage Site. Spanning 350 hectares, it hosts rich flora and 608 faunal species, including crocodiles, rare frogs, bats and birds like the Malabar trogon.



JULY 15, 2024

The Uttarakhand Forest Department inaugurated the state's first bird gallery at Jolly Grant, Dehradun. Displaying images of over 710 bird species, it highlights Uttarakhand's avian diversity.



MARCH 1, 2024

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi laid the foundation for Sikkim's first railway station in Rangpo, part of the 45 km Sivok-Rangpo rail project. This boosts defence, connectivity, tourism and economic growth.



AUGUST 11, 2024

The Paris Olympics 2024 celebrated sustainability, innovation and inclusivity. India's 117 athletes competed in 16 sports, winning six medals—one silver and five bronze.



MARCH 5, 2024

Kerala's KTCT School introduced Iris, India's first AI humanoid robot teacher, developed with Makerlabs Edutech. Iris enhances student engagement, personalises lessons, and supports diverse learning needs.



AUGUST 18, 2024

Maharashtra launched the Solar Village Scheme to power 100 villages with solar energy. Manyachiwadi, in Satara, became the first fully solar-powered village. The initiative provides free electricity to households.



APRIL 5, 2024

Bilquis Mir from Jammu and Kashmir, known as the 'Water Queen of Kashmir', became the first Indian woman jury member at the Paris Olympics 2024. Her achievements highlight the rising global impact of Indian women in sports.



SEPTEMBER 8, 2024

The Paris Paralympics 2024 showcased India's growing talent in adaptive sports. With 84 para-athletes competing in 12 sports, India achieved a historic 29 medals—seven gold, nine silver and thirteen bronze.



APRIL 22, 2024

President Smt Droupadi Murmu presented the Padma Awards at Rashtrapati Bhavan. 3 Padma Vibhushan, 8 Padma Bhushan and 55 Padma Shri Awards were given, honouring exceptional contributions.



SEPTEMBER 22, 2024

India achieved historic success at the 45th Chess Olympiad in Budapest, winning gold in both men's and women's team categories. With victories over Slovenia and Azerbaijan, India retained the Gopriandashvili Trophy.



MAY 23, 2024

Sixteen-year-old Kaamya Karthikeyan became the youngest Indian to summit Mt Everest from Nepal and the world's second-youngest girl to achieve this feat. She climbed alongside her father.



OCTOBER 4, 2024

India inaugurated Asia's largest imaging Cherenkov telescope, MACE, in Hanle, Ladakh. Developed by BARC, it detects gamma-ray flashes to study cosmic rays from supernovas and black holes.



JUNE 15, 2024

Indian Railways entered the Limca Book of Records for the most public service event attendees, with 40,19,516 people across 2,140 venues. The event inaugurated road bridges and station foundations.



NOVEMBER 4, 2024

Three-year-old Anish Sarkar from Kolkata became the youngest chess player to earn an official FIDE rating of 1555. Competing against older players, his advanced strategies have impressed experts.



YOUNGEST CHESS CHAMPION IN HISTORY

India's D Gukesh made history by winning the 2024 World Chess Championship at just 18 years, defeating China's Ding Liren. The 14-round final was intensely competitive, with Gukesh overcoming an early loss and capitalising on Ding's crucial error in the 55th move of the final round, securing a landmark victory. Earlier in 2024, Gukesh earned his spot by winning the Candidates Tournament. His composure, resilience and strategic brilliance throughout the championship demonstrated his exceptional talent. This triumph not only establishes Gukesh as the youngest World Chess Champion but also highlights India's rising prominence in the world of chess.
